History

The Victorian Era was the period of Queen Victoria's reign in the United Kingdom. This started in 1837 and lasted until 1901.

Life expectancy during the Victorian era rose from 38 years to 48 years!

Britain became an industrial superpower and produced huge amounts of the world's steel, iron, cotton and coal.

Many inventions from the Victorian era are used today such as the camera invented in 1838, the flushing toilet in 1851, the lightbulb in 1870 and the telephone in 1876!

In the 1800's child labour was normal and often very dangerous.

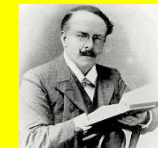


Children worked in factories, coal mines and chimney sweeps from the age of 5.
